For those who are anxious and depressed, for those who are addicted and weary, for those who are sick and suffering, for those who are awaiting a diagnosis, and for those living with a diagnosis. God in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

For the dying, for those who have died and for those who mourn their loss. We pray especially for Anne Curo, and for the twenty plus souls who lost their lives in the L.A. wildfires. Bring them to share in the wedding banquet of your kingdom. God in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**
